The Delmas School Burns

The Delmas School is located in the hills above Port-au-Prince. It is in a densely populated area where thousands of people live in crowded conditions. It is one of our smaller schools where about 80 children attend. It is in a strategic part of the city for ministry. Recently, a fire started in a nearby home, and it spread to the school. Now, a major portion of the school will have to be rebuilt and the roof will need to be replaced.

We have a local construction engineer who is helping us on various projects. We have asked him to evaluate the damage and give us a plan to rebuild the school. We are ready to move forward, but we need your help to get started. We want to begin with a starter fund of \$5,000. Your support is greatly appreciated.

The fire not only affected the building, it ruined the things that were inside the school. Books, school materials, desks and other supplies were ruined by the fire, smoke and the water from putting out the fire. The Delmas School needs much work to be ready to receive the school children again.

Right now, the children are meeting for classes inside the small church. Your support will help us rebuild the school in a timely manner and provide the Delmas children with a good education.
