Five New Houses



More than 500,000 homes were destroyed in the great earthquake of 2010. A million people were displaced. Many families still live in tents and hovels. Poor housing often means poor health. It is not unusual for children to sleep on hard

packed earth. Their dream is to have a bed.

Many people are still living in houses that have been condemned. These houses are marked with red paint that is supposed to mean "no entry". Plastic sheeting is used to keep the rain out.



Recently, Mission To Haiti team member Marv Van Riesen introduced us to a new kind of house which is starting to be used in Haiti. The Bin House is made of steel similar to a grain bin. The house has a double roof which insulates the heat well. The house offers 254 square feet of living

space and a loft to store things or provide extra space for sleeping. Pictured above is the team installing one of the lofts. The January Mission Team had 5 house kits shipped and delivered to Ti-goave in the south of Haiti. Marv along with friends from Northwest Iowa, Minnesota and Illinois
