Food For Families





Mission To Haiti continues to make food distribution a major part of this ministry to the people of Haiti. In Matthew 25:35, Jesus said, "I was hungry." The Apostle Paul described his hardships by saying, "In weariness and painfulness, in watchings often, in hunger and thirst..." II Corinthians 11:27.

Pictured above is a boy from the Tigoave school. We delivered food for him and his family. At times, families struggle to provide for themselves.

Providing food for the hungry is a responsibility that Mission To Haiti has taken on. It fulfills a basic need that the Haitian people desperately have. We provide families and school children with beans and rice. It is the main food staple of Haiti. Together, they provide the nourishment that children and families need to be healthy and strong. We want to make sure that all 4000 children in the schools are able to eat. At present, we support 13 Christian schools

and 2 vocational schools that are scattered across the country. It is common for children to go to school in the morning without eating anything at home. It is hard to learn on an empty stomach.

We need your help to provide food for families and children in the schools. In October, we are having a Special Event to raise money for food in Haiti. Our goal is to raise \$50,000 through monthly commitments and personal donations. You can provide food for a monthly commitment of \$25. You may set up your donation on a recurring basis online.



Through the website you can set up a monthly automatic payment to your credit card. More sponsors are using this feature to give their sponsorship. Your gifts for food are greatly appreciated.

Most of the food we distribute in Haiti comes from the United States. The price of food continues to increase. The cost to buy, prepare and distribute beans and rice is about \$1 per pound. A family pack of food will weigh about 25 pounds. Food for the schools can be delivered in large sacks.
