Dear Friends, the first vehicle that we ever had in Haiti was a 1972 Ford Econoline van. The Ole Ford ran faithfully for many years. It made countless trips across Haiti loaded with team members, Haitian pastors, bags of food and all sorts of materials. Its value could never be measured in miles driven, but in lives impacted for Christ.

A vital part of doing the work in Haiti is dependable transportation. We are blessed to have two Toyota Land Cruisers. It is not unusual for us to travel over flooded roads or on the top of a mountain ridge to reach the places we need to be.

Our 1986 Chevy school bus is used to carry work teams as well as children to the campus medical clinic. For the past few years, the bus has been having engine problems. One of the head gaskets was replaced which helped greatly. Recently, friends from Harbor Light Community Chapel had the radiator recored. We hope to install it during the July Team.

Keeping these vehicles repaired and maintained is not always easy, but it allows us to stay safe and minister to many. Parts, repairs and fuel are more expensive in Haiti. Thankfully, we have a 500 gallon diesel tank at the mission campus which we fill on a regular basis.

When we need to, we rent local transportation for the teams and for our Haitian partners.




