Two weeks later, our boxes were being unloaded at our mission campus. The shipping process usually takes 4 to 6 weeks. Pastor Brucely had to pay \$1,000 for customs and fees and trucking the boxes to the campus. We will put these supplies to work!

We are planning food distributions this month. Please be praying that everything goes well. Thank you!

On August 14, Haiti suffered a 7.2 magnitude earthquake that left over 2000 dead and thousands of people homeless. The church and school at Ti Goave are 30 miles from the epicenter. The school buildings suffered some damage which we will evaluate and help repair. As we prepare this newsletter, our US team is getting ready to leave for Haiti.

For the past several months, we have been assembling donations and buying supplies to send to Haiti. A few days before the earthquake, we made arrangements to ship everything. When we arrived at the shipyard the following Monday, we were grateful to learn that the shippers were shipping at no cost because of the earthquake. What a blessing from the Lord!
