Building A Better Future For Kensley

He and his family came to the mission campus to express their sincere thanks for your help. As we prepare this newsletter, Kensley's biopsy is being scheduled.

Kensley's father also wanted to tell us how he and his wife came to enroll their children in the Delmas school. They feel the Lord brought them to Delmas in their time of need. It reminds us that even when times are difficult, the Lord is at work.

Several years ago, the family was living in Pignon, a large town in

northern Haiti. Mr. Audate is a carpenter and a cabinet maker. At the time, he was working with a Christian ministry based in Pignon. It was there that he and his wife heard the Gospel and were saved. When his time of work had finished, the family left Pignon and moved to Port au Prince.

They settled in the neighborhood near the Delmas school. Work is not easy to find, but they were able to enroll their 4 children in the school. Neighbors told them that Delmas has a good program. They felt confident their children would do well there. Shortly after, Kensley and his brother Djacki were sponsored and accepted Christ.

Now as Kensley faces surgery, the family sees the value of Sponsorship. There is no way they could help Kensley by themselves.

Building A New Home For Joseph And His Family

The presence of gangs on the main road leading to villages like Cotin are making it difficult for people outside the area to travel there. At the same time, we know the Lord always finds a way!

We contacted the local builder who helped our engineer with the home projects last year. We asked him to give us a proposal for

building Joseph and his family a similar home with two rooms and a porch. The estimate was \$8,500.

We presented this to the sponsors and they were excited to move forward on it. We received an update recently showing the raised foundation being poured.

Once Joseph's house is finished, we have another house in Joineau that needs to be built for Vanelson and his family. The sponsors gave \$2,000 but need help with the remaining \$6,500. Having a good home means so much.
