Vocational School Begins New Year



The new school year has begun at the Beudet Vocational School. The incoming class has 25 students. They are ready to learn and prepare for their careers. The vocational school teaches plumbing, electrical and other trades, but most of the students want to learn how to sew. Clothes made to order are in constant demand in Haiti. School uniforms, suits

and dresses made by hand offer new styles at affordable prices. For that reason, sewing is a good trade.

The first day began with prayer, hymns and a Bible study. Many of the young people who enroll in the vocational school come from Christian families and are saved. For others, this may be their first exposure to the Gospel. For Pastor



and Madam Cadet, sharing the Gospel and growing in faith is a priority.

The Vocational School needs \$1,500 to buy supplies and materials for the year. In addition, each student needs tools and materials that will cost \$100.
