In October, a large gang moved through neighborhoods around Croix des Bouquets, a major city north of us. Gang members forced families from their homes for the purpose of robbing anything of value. These families were forced to leave their neighborhoods to find safety. They relocated to Cazeau.

Many of these families moved in with friends and relatives in our area. Junior who serves with us said that he now has 30 people living in his home. Families who could not find a place to live took up residence in the Cazeau town square. We went to the square to see the situation for ourselves.

Scores of families were living in tents and makeshift homes. Some of them were living in the open. They were weary and very discouraged. We contacted a faithful sponsor who provided food for 300 families. The food filled a pressing need and gave them hope.

As we send this newsletter, families are still living in the Cazeau town square. The food which we gave them last month is finished. They need more food.

There are 1000 families who we are able to reach who need food.

Today he is the pastor and the principal. Under his leadership the church and school have grown tremendously. Families in the surrounding communities are looking for an active school to enroll their children. Lestere is that school.

Your prayers and sponsorship support are having an impact. Lestere provides a solid education, school meals, spiritual training and more. School enrollment is growing. Last month, we asked for special help with school supplies. Lestere is a school which desperately need this help.
