
Partnership In Missions

Called To Serve The Least Of These

This is Brunel. For years, he served on Mission To Haiti's mission teams as an interpreter. When the medical teams came to Haiti, Brunel helped them care for people through the mobile medical clinics. The experience cultivated Brunel's love for helping those in need.

In November, an anonymous donor provided Brunel with a brand new motorcycle. Bill Jr. had the opportunity to arrange the purchase and delivery of it. Brunel did not know beforehand that he was receiving a new motorcycle. So when he saw it. he was speechless. He explained the blessing this new motorcycle will be for the new ministry that God has called him.

As they sat and talked, Brunel shared with Bill Jr. about the church where he and his family are serving.



The church is in the town of Libertè near the boarder with the Dominican Republic. The organization that built the church is no longer there. The Haitian pastor who led the church died. As Brunel explained, the people live in misery. Families there are among the poorest he has seen. One family has young teenage daughters who are pregnant.

Brunel visited the church and immediately the congregation was drawn to him.
They asked him to be their pastor, and he agreed. He is attending a Bible school near by so he can be fully equipped to serve as the pastor. The church is already seeing results. So far 40 people have been saved.

Brunel said the two passages that inspire him are James 1:27 and Matthew 25:40, "...inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me." Brunel said it's his dream to serve in a church like this. We believe God will use men like this to bring revival to Haiti.
