This summer, pastors and principals are preparing to host summer programs for their children and young people. The summer is an ideal time to host these programs. These events are uplifting and engaging for everyone. They are great opportunities to encourage our current students and to invite new children and families to become a part of the ministry of Mission To Haiti.

There are two kinds of programs that are ready to begin: Vacation Bible Schools and Vocational Summer Camp. The VBS programs are week-long fun-filled events that draw in hundreds of boys and girls. There are craft projects and Bible stories and hearty meals for the children. Most importantly, they hear the Gospel. **Our pastors need \$5,000 to host 5 Vacation Bible Schools.**

For the past year, Pastor Cadet who directs our Vocational School has been wanting to start a second vocational school in central Haiti. He has explored the area and has found a place where they can begin. This would also be an ideal place for a new church to be planted.

Pastor and Madam Cadet would like to host a Vocational Summer Camp to build a nucleus of students to begin. **They need \$1,500 for this summer camp.** Your offering would get them started.

As we were preparing this newsletter, we received an update on the food distributions. Junior and our Haitian Partners delivered 250 large packages of rice and beans to Joineau. The whole distribution was incredible.

For nearly two years, outsiders have not been able to travel to Joineau, not even our Haitian Partners. It is because of the strangle hold that the gangs have on that area. Recently, our people secured permission to go and distribute food.

Junior described the families there as desperate. The Food For Families fund is exhausted. \$9,000 will provide food for 250 more families at another church. Thank you for giving!
