Sponsor A Child At The New Preschool


Work on the new preschool is moving along very well. In July, new office equipment was bought and set up. A new solar system was purchased and installed. Artisans have begun painting the inside and outside of the new school. The vibrant colors are evidence that something exciting is happening at the new school. We posted videos on our Facebook and Instagram pages, so please check them out.

The new school will be called the Mission To Haiti Academy. The preschool is the first phase. Our plan is to continue expanding at the mission campus with an elementary school, a middle school and high school, a vocational school and a school of ministry. It will become the model for the other schools where we are serving.

At present, Mission To Haiti is serving in twelve locations across Haiti. As the Lord opens new doors of opportunity we want to expand our locations. We want the new Academy to be the model that our partnering churches and schools will use to provide children and young people with a quality Christian education from childhood to adulthood.

The capacity of the new preschool is 120 children. Right now, there are 101 who are registered. Of these, only 66 have sponsors. Every preschooler needs a sponsor.

New sponsors, current sponsors and even former sponsors are contacting us to sponsor again. We will continue to post on our website children who need a sponsor. We encourage you to get more involved.

Summer Camps And Bible Schools Starting

Thank you for your wonderful response to the Vacation Bible Schools and Summer Camps. As we prepare this newsletter, new offerings have been recieved to use for the summer programs.

In July, the vocational summer camp got started. Pastor and Mrs. Cadet are leading a new group of students in the Artibonite region of Haiti. At Beudet, Pastor Jean Claude is hosting a month-long summer camp to draw children and families who were displaced by the gangs.

Five Bible schools will be starting soon including a large VBS at the mission campus. Others are asking for help. As you give, we will fund more Bible schools. We are praying that many children will be saved.

The Longevity Of The Gospel

In July, we met a Haitian pastor who told us a remarkable story. The pastor is Pierre Vaillant. He has a small congregation in the neighboring town of Croix des Missions. They are construting a new church building. They completed the walls, but the church has no roof. Pastor Pierre came asking for \$3,000 to install a roof onto the church.

Pastor Pierre shared with us that he is from a small town in central Haiti called St. Michel de l'attalaye. When he was a teenager, two American pastors came to his town. They held evangelistic meetings at the local Baptist church in St. Michel. It was at one of those meetings that Pastor Pierre gave his life to Christ and was born agan. That event changed his life.

In the summer of 1976, Bill Sr. and fellow pastor, Lawson Jolly, were invited to go to St. Michel to preach the Gospel. It was on that trip that Bill Sr. felt the call to serve in Haiti as a missionary. It changed his life and our family forever. We may never fully know the impact that our actions will have in Haiti. We are confident the impact is eternal.
